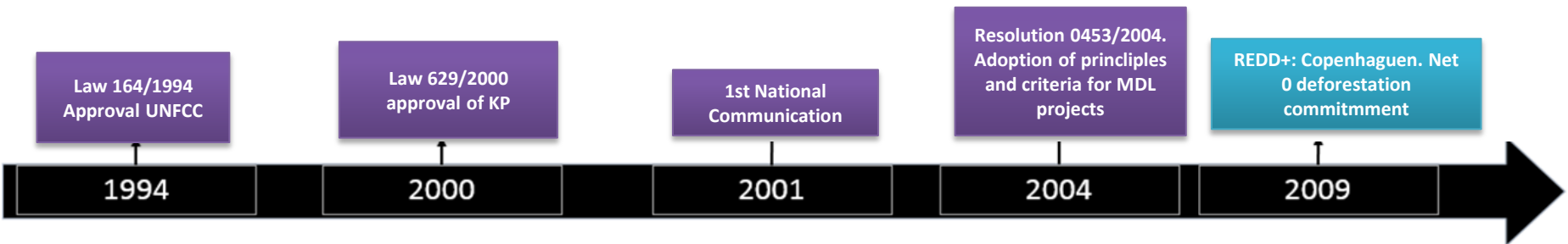
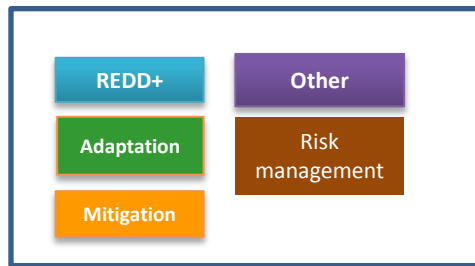

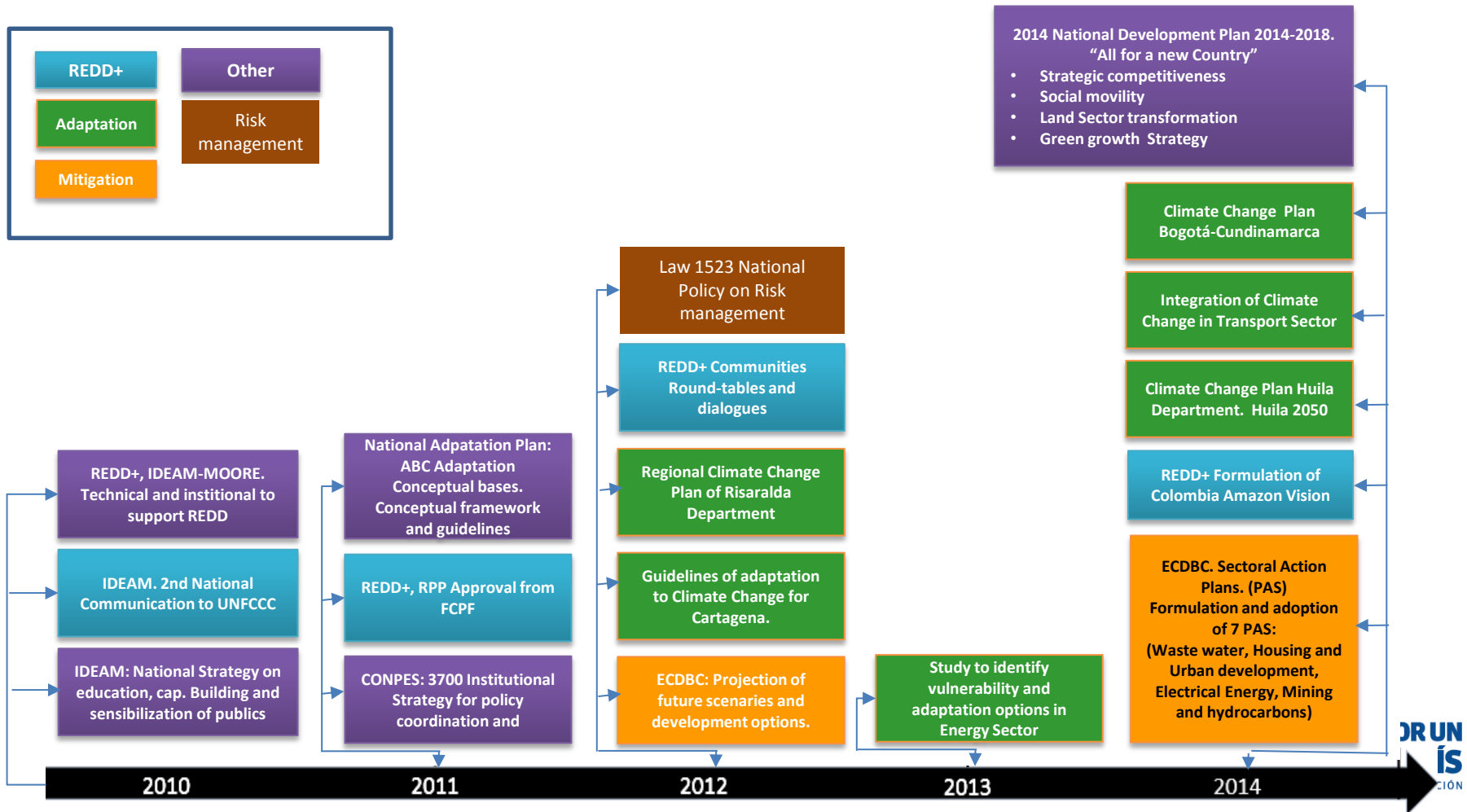

Paragraph 170. Sectors to set quantitative goals to 2020, 2025, 2030

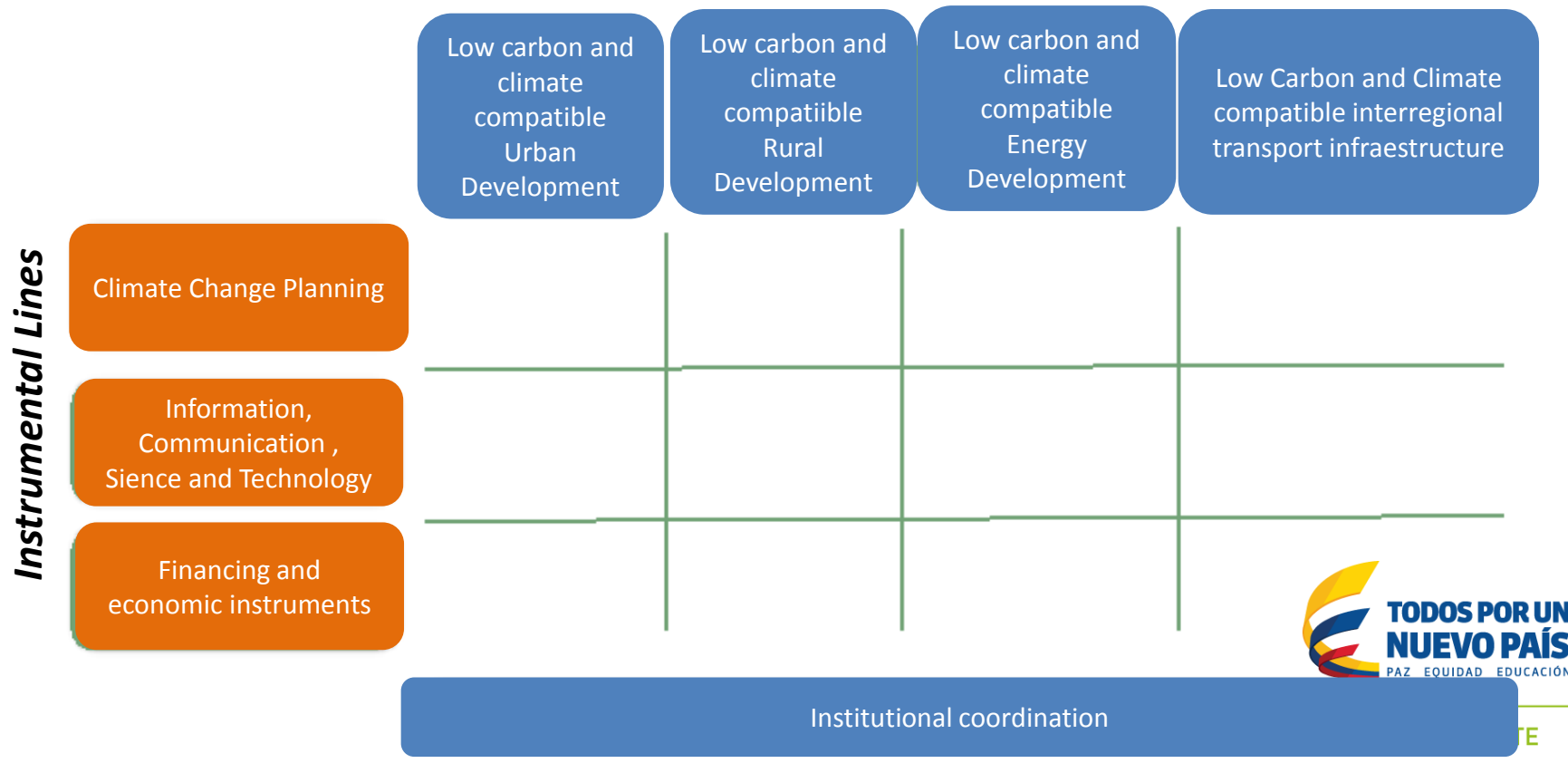

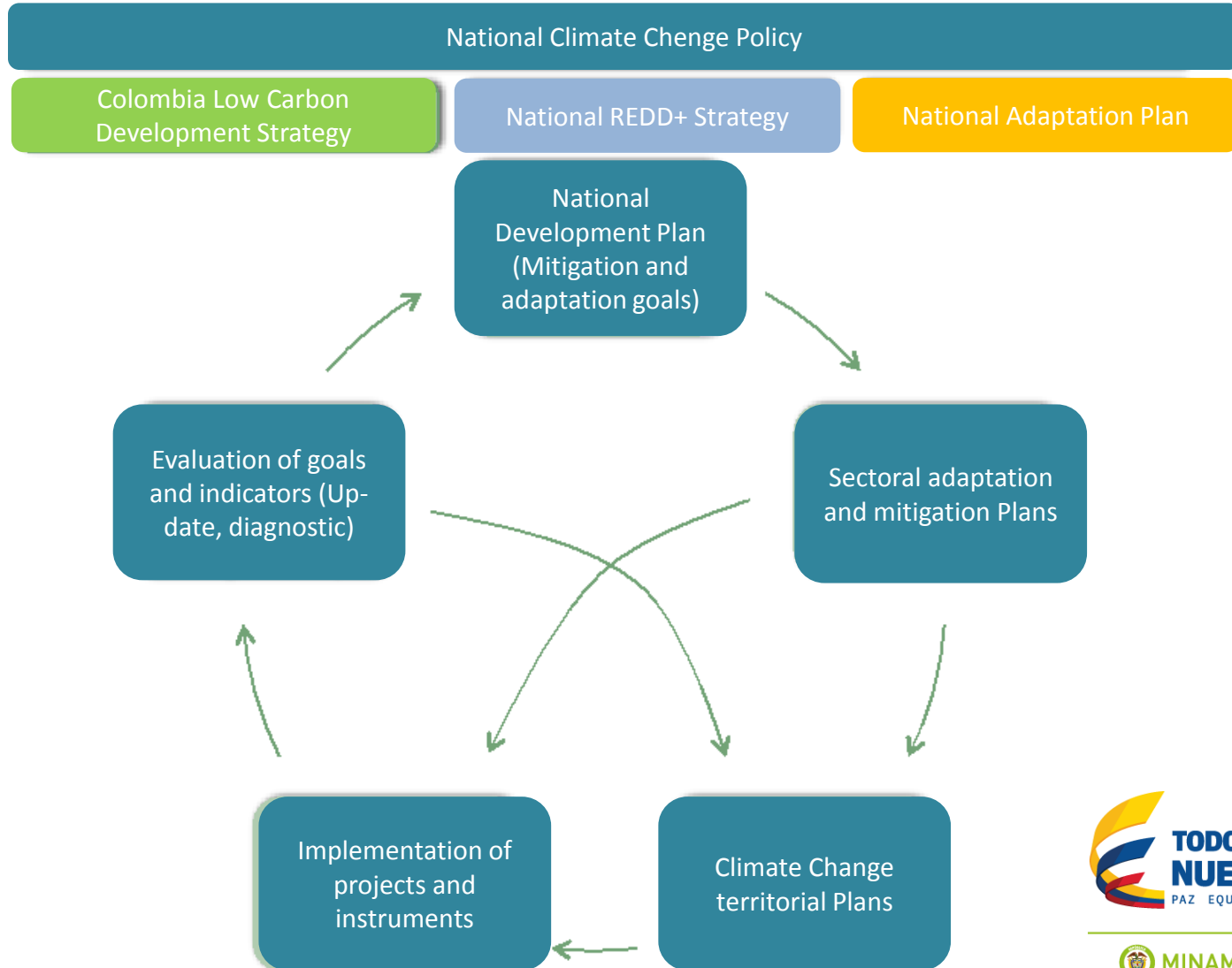

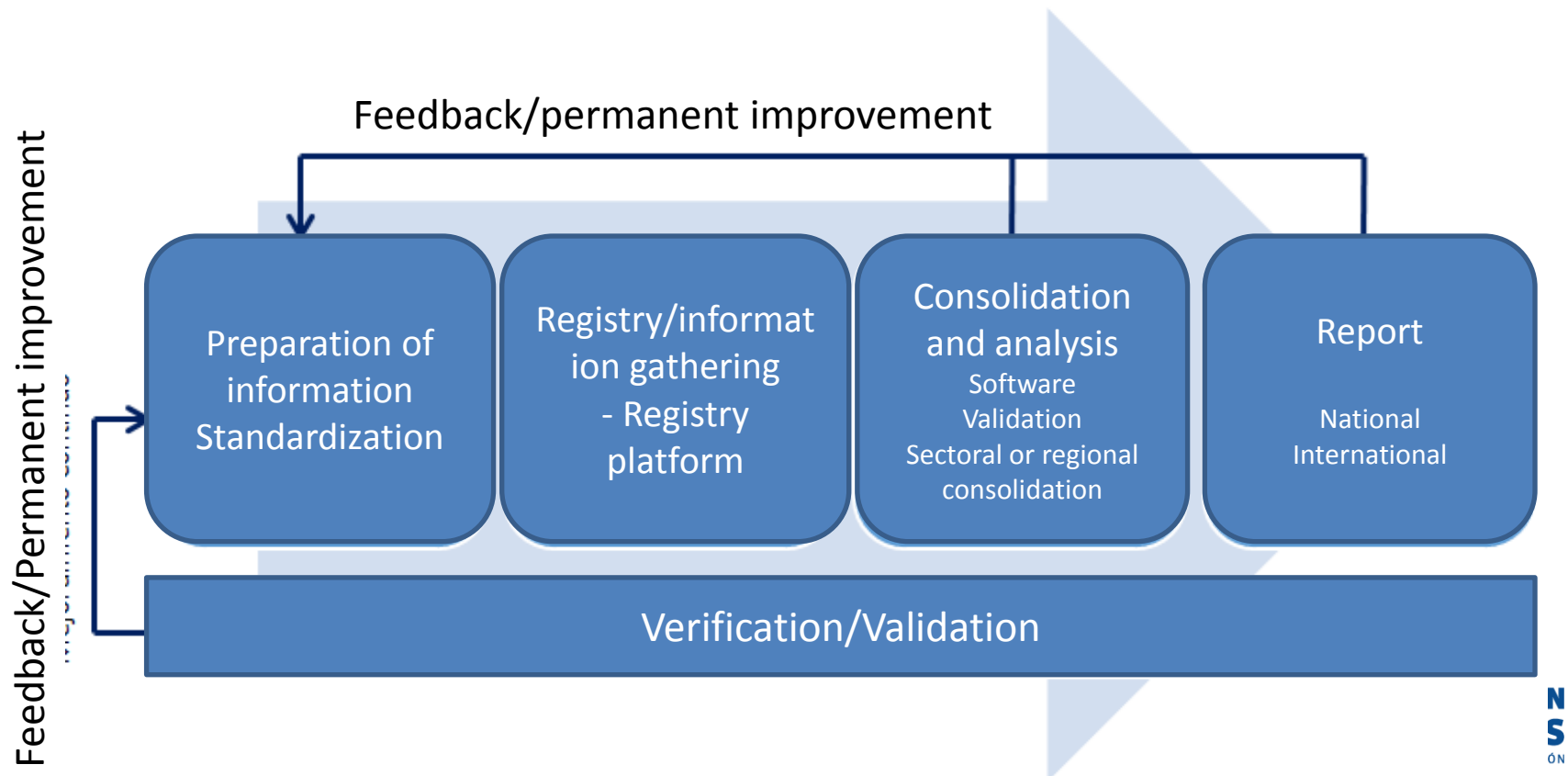

4. Challenges ahead

- Robust MRV.
 - ✓ Regulation, design and operation of National Registry for Emissions Reductions.
 - ✓ MRV System development: Includes technical guides, protocols, capacity development, legal framework and software.
 - ✓ Definition of roles and competencies
 - ✓ RETC. Registry of emissions and contaminants transfer.

- Sectoral empowerment and adequate monitoring of achievements

Economic instruments:

- Feasibility analysis for Green taxes
- Feasibility analysis of economic incentives

- Energy: Regulations for the Law 1715 on Renewable Energy.
- Transport: Demand management. Policy on Smart transportation systems. Incentives to nonmotorized transportation means.
- AFOLU: Update forest legislation. Control to ilegal clearing and ilegal Wood harvest and trade. Policy on environmental services.
