Introduction to the clinics

- Case Clinics guide a team or a group of peers through a process in which a case giver presents a case, representing a current MRV challenge they are facing, and team members help as consultants.
- Participants are encouraged to:
 - Generate new ways to look at a challenge or question.
 - Develop new approaches for responding to the challenge.
- Thus, the purpose of a case clinic is to access the wisdom and experience of peers to help the case giver to address their challenge.










Working principles

- Hierarchy does not matter in this group setting.
 - All are equal peers
- The case giver owns the problem/challenge:
 - Peers do not "take over" the problem/challenge. The peers are there to listen and to share their relevant experience.
- We are thinking together as a group









Roles

- Case giver
 - Shares the problem/challenge being faced
- Coaches/peers
 - Listen carefully to the case giver, share experiences, thoughts and new ideas
- Facilitator/Time keeper:
 - Guides the group through the process and manages the time









Process

- Clarification of roles and schedule (5 mins)
- Description of the current situation and challenge (15 mins)
- Defining the problem statement (15 mins)
- Consultation from the coaches (30 mins)
- Initial response from case giver (10 mins)
- Further development of the options (60 mins)
- Next steps (10 mins)










Groups and challenges

- 5 groups:
 - Group 1: Data collection and management
 - Group 2: Data collection and management
 - Group 3: Monitoring of land cover changes
 - Group 4: Capacity building priorities modalities and approaches
 - Group 5: Specific improvements to different elements of the inventory
- Each group should have c.4 coaches.










Logistics
