



Announcement: <u>NDC Handover Checklist</u> launch event:

Wednesday, December 15th, 9:00 - 10:00 CET or Thursday, December 16th, 16:00 - 17:00 CET

- The <u>NDC Handover Checklist</u> is a tool created for governments to document all information relevant to their NDC revision and update process.
- Its main objective is to maintain the knowledge of the key aspects from the recent NDC revision process and thereby prepare for future NDC update processes.
- The checklist is developed as a flexible template that can be tailored to the context of each country. Governments can fill in the checklist and share it with relevant stakeholders at their own discretion.
- The tool was developed based on the experience of GIZ and Climate Analytics as well as experts from partner organizations.


