at the Petersberg Climate Dialogue

by South Africa, Republic of Korea and Germany.

- Promote the implementation of the Enhanced
 Transparency Framework (ETF) through providing demand-driven capacity development and enabling mutual learning in South-South-North exchange formats.








Regional level

Examples of Assistance

- ✓ Reviewing GHG inventories for specific sectors
- ✓ Preparing for the submission of first or updated
 BUR until end of 2024
- ✓ Preparation of countries for the ETF and climate reporting requirements under the UNFCCC, e.g. Biennial Transparency Report (BTR)
- ✓ Frameworks for developing/updating NDCs and Long-term Strategies (LTS)
- ✓ Supporting the analysis of BUR1 as preparation for the international consultation and analysis (ICA) process
- Adaptation reporting

Modes of Delivery

Executed through various formats, tailored to the specific country context:

- Technical review and expert guidance on national and sectoral climate policies, plans and programs
- In-country workshops for national staff and experts
- Sharing of studies, analysis, reports, tools, guidance documents
- One-to-one coaching
- South-south exchange among an advanced country and a country with support needs









Biennial Transparency Report Guidance and Roadmap Tool NDC HANDOVER CHECKLIST


